A familiar story that is often misunderstood and misapplied.

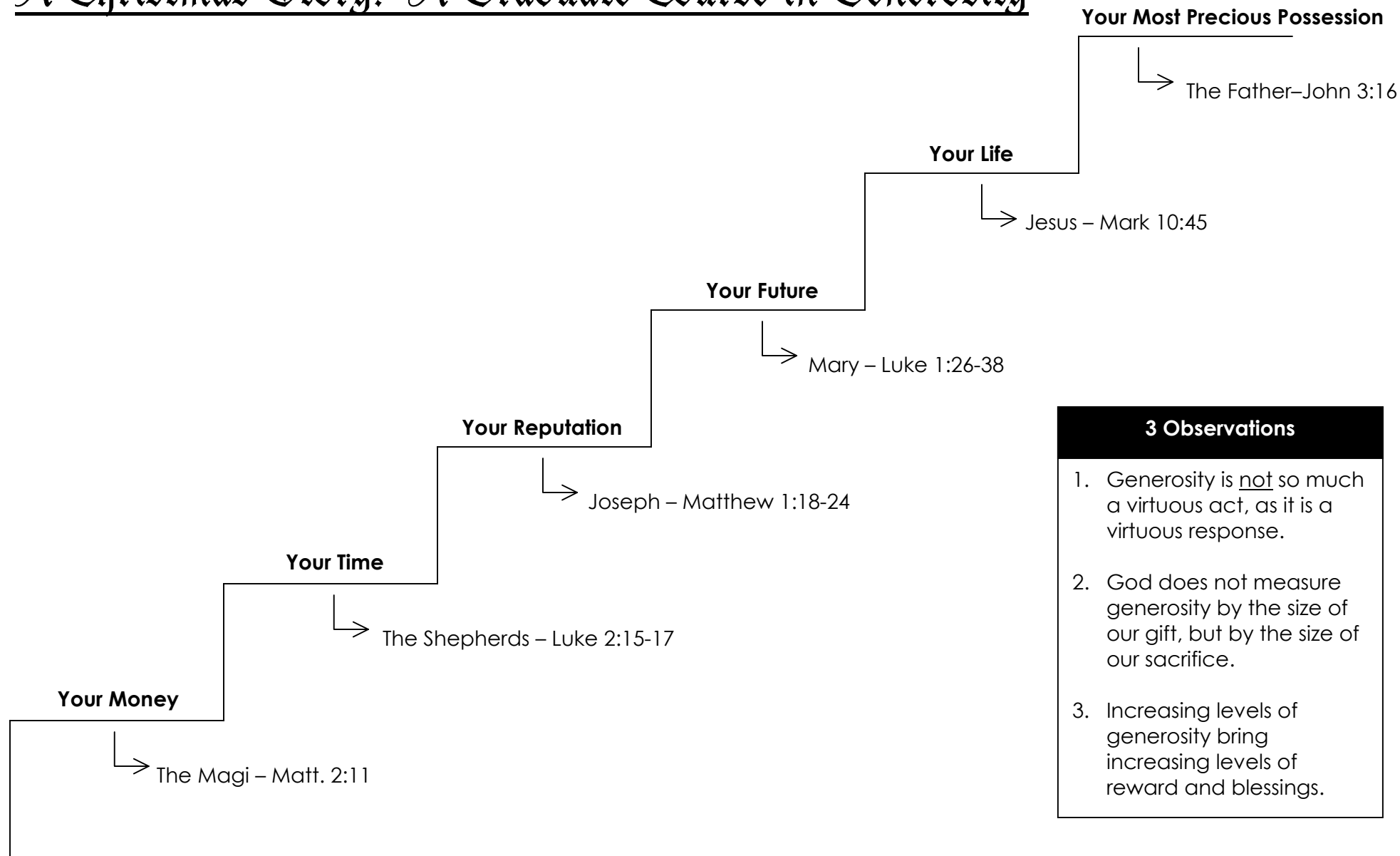

3 Observations

3. Increasing levels of generosity bring increasing levels of reward and blessings.

Summary and Personal Application

1. **Generosity always begins with God; it is the visible expression of His infinite, incomprehensible love for us.**

James 1:17, Ephesians 3:14-21

Question: Are you living with the constant awareness that you are the object of God's infinite and unconditional love?

Application: Pray Ephesians 3:14-21 for yourself daily for 30 days.

2. **Our generosity is the visible expression of our love (response to God's love) for God.**

John 14:21

Question: Where are you on your generosity journey with God? What "next step" do you sense God's Spirit prompting you to take?

Application: Memorize John 14:21 this week.

3. **Generous living begins with the "training wheels" of money and possessions and graduates to making our "very lives" a gift to God as a perpetual act of worship.**

Romans 12:1-2

Question: Why is it so critical to remember that God wants the very best for us as we grow in our generosity?

Application: List 25 specific blessings from God before the new year begins and share them with a friend.
